AN OVERVIEW

As we move into the second decade of the 21st century, outside pressures continue to affect the economic success of pork producers. The need to monitor these forces and decide what adjustments will be necessary to ensure our continuity is a major concern.

The 2010 Swine Institute will examine methods to maintain efficient production on the farm as well as address off-farm issues that have the potential to significantly impact production practices.

Animal welfare vs the animal rights activist agenda has brought the issue to Missouri with Proposition B, the Puppy Mill Cruelty Prevention Act. We will consider the legislation and what impact it may have on large animal production. Guest speakers will discuss the latest strategies of animal activists, including an update on Ohio. We will also look at how consumer demand has been impacted by legislation controlling animal confinement.

If approved as proposed, the GIPSA rule will have a major impact on the ability of producers to manage production costs and market risks. The Swine Institute will examine how the proposed rule might affect management decisions and options.

Legal topics such as contracting, preventing nuisance suits, and determining jurisdiction in regulating animal agriculture will be discussed.

The dinner program will feature Erin Daley, economist, manager of research and analysis for the U.S. Meat Export Federation. Daley will speak about the re-opening of the China market and its impact on the U.S. swine industry.

Other guest speakers—experts in their fields, together with the Commercial Agriculture Program swine focus team leaders will analyze the issues facing pork producers in the 21st century and propose strategies to address them.
